- Building and maintaining positive relationships
- Sharing knowledge and expertise
- Supporting and mentoring others

Expectations

Compliance with Laws and Regulations

- Understanding and adhering to relevant laws and regulations
- Reporting any concerns or issues to the relevant authorities

Respect for Diversity

- Valuing and celebrating diversity
- Promoting inclusivity and accessibility
- Avoiding cultural insensitivity or bias

Confidentiality

- Not sharing confidential information without permission
- Protecting sensitive information from unauthorized access
- Being mindful of our social media presence and online activities

Conflict of Interest

- Disclosing potential conflicts of interest
- Avoiding situations that may compromise our objectivity
- Prioritizing the interests of NTA and its members

Reporting Concerns

- Reporting any suspected violations of this Code of Ethics
- Cooperating with investigations and inquiries
- Maintaining confidentiality and respecting the privacy of others

Consequences of Non-Compliance

- Warning: A formal warning may be issued to the member.
- Suspension: Membership may be suspended for a specified period.
- Termination: Membership may be terminated.
